## Item 1. Roll Call.

Roll was taken, it was noted that a quorum was present.

Action: Chair Tongate recognized former Commissioner Maxine Goad, who stated that it had been an honor and a privilege to serve on the Water Quality Control Commission, and offered her thanks. Commissioner Glass acknowledged the service that former Commissioner Goad had offered the Commission over her tenure, noting that she brought a wealth of historical knowledge, an amazing grasp of the issues, and that she'll be sorely missed. He offered the Commission's thanks.

## Item 2. Approval of Agenda.

- Action: Mr. Sloane moved Commission adoption of the Agenda. Mr. Gatterman seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
- Item 3. Approval of January 11, 2011 meeting minutes; approval of April 5, 2011 minutes.
- Action: Mr. Glass moved adoption of the January 11, 2011 meeting minutes. Mr. Gatterman seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
- Action: Mr. Glass moved adoption of the April 5, 2011 meeting minutes with minor revisions. Mr. Sloane seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
- Item 4. Approval of consolidation and revision of the Water Quality Management Plan and Continuing Planning Process. Eric Ames, NMED/OGC, Pam Homer and James Hogan, NMED Surface Water Quality Bureau.
- Action: Eric Ames, Pam Homer, and James Hogan presented NMED's request for approval of updated and consolidated Water Quality Management Plan and Continuing Planning Process to the Commission. NMED answered questions from the Commission. Mr. Tongate asked for public comment. Rachel Conn, representing Amigos Bravos, presented written and oral testimony to the Commission on the proposed hydrology protocol. NMED addressed Amigos Bravos comments and answered further questions from the Commission. Jon Klingel provided written and oral testimony to the Commission. NMED addressed Mr. Klingel's comments and answered further questions from the Commission. Mr. Sloane moved to adopt NMED's updated and consolidated Water Quality Management Plan and Continuing Planning Process as presented with minor edits. Mr. Sanders seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

- Item 5. Approval of Statement of Reasons in WQCC 10-10 (R), Petition for Rulemaking for Procedures Governing State Certification of Federal Permits under the Clean Water Act, NMED, Petitioner. Melanie Carver, NMAGO.
- Action: Mr. Glass moved to adopt the Statement of Reasons as presented. Mr. Sloane seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously with Mr. Bland, Mr. Taylor, and Mr. Hansen abstaining.
- Item 6. Motion Hearing and Decision—Cattle Growers Association's Motion to Stay in WQCC 10-01 (R), Designation of Outstanding National Resource Waters. Dan Dolan for Movants, Tannis Fox, NMED/OGC, Erik Schlenker-Goodrich for River Groups; Jay Tutchton and Samantha Ruscavage-Barz for WildEarth Guardians; Melanie Carver, NM Atty. General's Office, Commission Counsel.
- Action: Extensive discussion among Counsel for the parties and Commissioners related to allowable testimony, witnesses, and exhibits. The Hearing Officer, Mr. Sanders, ruled that several statements contained within the Cattle Grower's exhibits would be allowed as statements for the purpose of public comment only and would otherwise be given no probative or evidentiary value. The Hearing Officer distributed copies of the Cattle Grower's Docketing Statement filed with the Court of Appeals on April 18, 2011 to the Commissioners.

All witnesses were sworn in, and the Cattle Growers made their presentation in support of a stay. The hearing proceeded with discussion, objections, cross-examination, and redirect. Ms. Fox moved for the equivalent of a "directed verdict" based on the Cattle Growers' inability to meet the threshold for proving irreparable harm, and asked the Commission to deny the stay without having to hear from all the other witnesses, who would have testified in opposition to a stay. Mr. Schlenker-Goodrich and Ms. Ruscavage-Barz concurred. Ms. Carver, Commission attorney advised the Commission of its options and the broad scope of its discretion.

Mr. Sloane moved to dismiss the Cattle Growers' Motion to Stay based on a failure to meet the threshold of irreparable harm. Mr. Bland seconded the motion.
