Item 1. Roll Call

Roll was called; a quorum was present.

Item 2. How Notice Requirements Were Met

Ms. Casados described how notice requirements were met for the meeting consistent with the Board's Open Meetings Act Resolution.

Item 3. Approval of Agenda

Action: Ms. Peacock suggested moving Item #6 and 7 after Item #12.

Ms. Peacock moved Board approval of the agenda as amended. Ms. Ryan seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Item 4. Public Comment Unrelated to Agenda Items

Mr. Crawford asked the Board members not to recuse themselves from participating in the upcoming hearings on greenhouse gas emissions. He acknowledged the Board members for their good work.

Item 5. Approval of meeting minutes, September 2, 2011.

Action: Ms. Peacock moved to approve the minutes as amended. Mr. Fulfer seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Item 6. Hearing in EIB 11-06 (R), Proposed Revisions to 20.2.99 NMAC, Conformity to the State Implementation Plan of Transportation Plans, Programs, and Projects; Bill Grantham, NMED/OGC, Gail Cook, NMED/AQB. Time Estimate: 30 Minutes

Action: The hearing in EIB 11-06(R) was recorded and transcribed by Cheryl Arreguin of Kathy Townsend Court Reporters. The transcript is available in the office of the Board Administrator.

Ms. Peacock moved to approve the proposed amendments by the Petitioner and as amended by the Board. Mr. Bryce second the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Item 7. Hearing in EIB 11-13 (R), Amendments to Petroleum Storage Tank Regulations, throughout 20.5.1--20.5.18 NMAC and proposed new Part 20.5.19; Susan George and Leigh Brunner. Time Estimate: 1 Hour

Action: The hearing in EIB 11-13(R) was recorded and transcribed by Cheryl Arreguin of Kathy Townsend Court Reporters. The transcript is available in the office of the Board Administrator.

The Board determined to leave the record open, and continue the hearing on November 7, 2011.

Item 8. Hearing in EIB 11-14 (R), Board Rulemaking Procedures, 20.1.1 NMAC. Felicia Orth, NMED/ Hearing Officer; Douglas Meiklejohn, Jonathan Block, R. Bruce Frederick, and Eric Jantz, NMELC. Time Estimate: 1 Hour

Action: The hearing in EIB 11-14(R) was recorded and transcribed by Cheryl Arreguin of Kathy Townsend Court Reporters. The transcript is available in the office of the Board Administrator.

Mr. Casciano moved to replace “bifurcate” with “divide” in line 251, page 5 of the red-line version of changes. Ms. Peacock seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Ms. Ryan moved to accept the proposed revision to 20.1.1.304B and add at the end of the word “accepted” period, capitalize “however, comments may be posted on the EIB web page.” Mr. Volkerding seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Ms. Ryan moved to change 20.1.1.400B (2) to read, “The hearing officer may allow a brief opening statement by any party who wishes to make one.” Ms. Peacock seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Ms. Ryan moved to leave the proposed language in 20.1.1.401C, line 350. Mr. Fulfer seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Ms. Peacock moved to change “to include” to “including” on line 383, page 8, 20.1.405. Mr. Bryce seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Ms. Peacock moved to delete lines 430-432 in 20.1.1.501, and add the word “at” after the word “heard” in line 435. Ms. Ryan seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Ms. Peacock moved that the Board adopt all of the Petitioner’s suggested changes to 20.1.1 NMAC as proposed and amended. Mr. Casciano seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Item 9. Motion hearing (several motions) in EIB 11-15/17 (R), Proposed Repeal of Greenhouse Gas Cap and Trade Provisions and Reporting and Verification Requirements; and 11-16 (R), Proposed Repeal of Greenhouse Gas Reduction Program. Action: The hearing in EIB 11-15/17(R), and EIB 11-16 (R) was recorded and transcribed by Cheryl Arreguin of Kathy Townsend Court Reporters. The transcript is available in the office of the Board Administrator

The Board heard arguments and considered the motions filed related to Board member disclosure, voir dire and recusal. Members Fulfer, and Casciano recused themselves from further participation. No other recusals were made. Following disclosures by the other Board members, Mr. Federick withdrew his request for voir dire.

Ms. Orth addressed the other three motions as Hearing Officer. The first motion was the motion to strike parts of Petitioners' statement of reasons. The motion was denied. The second motion was an objection to improper hearing procedures and request for reconsideration. Ms. Orth rejected the characterization of the Board members' communication with the Hearing Officer as ex parte. Ms. Orth stated that she will correct the order concerning the September 7, 2011 conference to add the statement of reasons and closing arguments from prior proceedings as documents to be considered in the current proceedings. Otherwise, the objection to the order establishing procedures and request to vacate or amend was denied by Ms. Orth.
