Ms. Peacock moved to delete lines 430-432 in 20.1.1.501, and add the word "at" after the word "heard" in line 435. Ms. Ryan seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Ms. Peacock moved that the Board adopt all of the Petitioner's suggested changes to 20.1.1 NMAC as proposed and amended. Mr. Casciano seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
