Mr. Fulfer moved that Agenda Item 12 be moved up before continuation of Item 8 because of the traffic jam north of Santa Fe. Mr. Volkerding seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Vigil noted that the time was appropriate for action on Items discussed in executive session. The Board had been presented with a report on mediation on Items b., c., and d., out of which came a proposed joint motion for 180-day remand to the Board and a stay of the current appellate proceedings.

Mr. Fulfer moved the Board approve the settlement agreement to remand the matters referenced in Items b., c., and d back to the Board and also to give Mr. Vigil authority to sign all of the necessary pleadings – all 17. Member Ryan seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Fulfer moved to deny the Motion to Dismiss in EIB 11-08 (R) in its entirety. This motion was not seconded or voted on. The Board discussed the Motion to Dismiss further.

Ms. Ryan moved the Board grant the Motion to Dismiss in part regarding Subsection D referring to the penalty section and to deny all other parts of the Motion to Dismiss. Mr. Volkerding seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Ms. Orth discussed with the Board how testimony would be presented for the hearing in August, and the Board and parties agreed that a similar procedural order would be issued as in EIB 11-03.
